The Challenge:



The Winners:

After the judges' deliberation I am pleased to announce the Grand Prize Winner as Team 3: MSK ONCall, and the People's Choice Award Winner as Team 2: MSK Apollo!

Team 3's winning solution was MSK ONCall, an online platform that combines an intuitive site design with emergent trends in technology (including AI and interactive hardware touchpoints) to make MSK's knowledge base accessible to as many people as possible. Embodying the big bet around building a knowledge base for the layperson, this solution includes promotion of the 2014 MSK campaign tagline, "More science, Less fear", brought to life today through education, community outreach, and involvement in popular media. Congratulations to the team — Michael Connelly, Justin Fagan, Joshua Gardos, Lydia Hu, Steffen Loh, Nicholas Plante, Kristen Russack and Christie Yu — on your Grand Prize win.

The People's Choice Award winners, Team 2, presented MSK Apollo, an app that aims to use a combination of ambient computing, smart wearables, and gamification in order to make monitoring from home fun for our patients. Patients are rewarded with virtual points and prizes when they eat healthily, exercise regularly, and use their smart wearables. In addition, Apollo makes use of an Alpowered chatbot to address patient mental health concerns, while also helping them to fill out forms and make appointments.
